Current and historical social issues and movements will be included in the coursework (mass incarceration, real estate redlining, and inequality in healthcare).

Graduates may continue their education in a Bachelor's degree program and/or immediately join the workforce.

According to the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics Occupational Outlook Handbook, careers in community and social services will grow faster than average (approximately 14%) by 2026.

HARCUM COLLEGE

HARCUM COLLEGE operates under a rolling admissions policy, which means that the Admissions Committee reviews each application file as soon as it is complete. Applicants will be notified within 10 working days of a decision, and of any conditions necessary for entry. Prospective students are advised to apply as early as possible to ensure admission to the program of choice.
